WE DID THE HOMEWORK FOR YOU, AND NOW, YOU GET to decide whether Portland-area schools pass the test. For the second year in a row, we bring you the most relevant and up-to-date information on 620 schools and 21 districts in the Portland metropolitan area. We combed through federal rankings, crunched test scores, deciphered statewide assessments and spoke to dozens of educators, administrators and government staffers—all to compile snapshots of our public, private and charter schools into one comprehensive portfolio.

For Oregon, the results are mixed. By the standards of the federal No Child Left Behind Act, 82 percent of elementary and middle schools achieved a passing grade—while only 31 percent of high schools did. And on the newly revamped SAT, high school students scored higher in math than they did the previous year, but slipped lower in reading. However, standardized test scores rose overall in the state.

Portland’s portrait, in particular, looks better than it has in the past, with Portland Public Schools making progress on the state’s 2005-6 School Report Cards (which track schoolwide improvement). A full 99 percent scored “satisfactory” or higher based on the five-tier rating system, and 24 percent climbed up a notch from last year’s rating.

Whether it’s test scores or student-teacher ratios that you find most compelling, our progress report will provide ample prep to increase your education IQ. ➤

TERMINOLOGY 101

Here's a cheat sheet that will help you decipher key language and methodology when assessing school rankings, scores and statistics.

ADEQUATE YEARLY PROGRESS

Under the No Child Left Behind Act, a school must meet a minimum level of improvement in up to nine student categories each year. "Y" indicates all categories met the requirement; "N" indicates at least one did not.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)/ INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

These programs offer college-level courses and

exams designed to help students gain college credit (the IB curriculum emphasizes an international focus).

CHARTER SCHOOLS

Public schools sponsored by local or state educational organizations that are operated by educators, parents and community members as semiautonomous schools of choice

ETHNIC DIVERSITY

The percentage of non-Caucasians at a school

HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS (HQT)

Teachers who are fully licensed by the state, hold a bachelor's degree and demonstrate mastery of subject knowledge (not applicable [N/A] for Washington schools)

OREGON SCHOOL REPORT CARD GRADE

The Oregon Department of Education's overall rating for a school, converted to a letter grade: exceptional = A; strong = B; satisfactory = C; low = D; unacceptable = F (NR = Not rated)

OREGON STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT (OSA) and WASHINGTON ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT

LEARNING (WASL): Our data reflect scores on standardized math and reading tests for grades 3 through 8 and 10. The number indicates the percentage of students who met or exceeded the state standard.

STUDENT/TEACHER RATIO

The number of students enrolled divided by the number of FTE (full-time equivalency) teachers
